### **Review – Lindle Willnow’s final report regarding odor problems at Brick-Ends Farm**

The Board of Health reviewed a final report from Chairman Lindle Willnow regarding odor problems at Brick-Ends Farm. Farm owner Peter Britton had made a few minor comments about the report. Britton no longer accepts gelatin waste or treatment plant biosolids at his recycling operation.

Aside from one call the Board of Health has received in the last few weeks about the odor there hasn’t been any further issues. A copy of Willnow’s report will be included with the approved minutes for this meeting.

### **Discussion – 2010/2011 Flu Clinic Season (Partner’s Home Care Contract)**

Discussion on continuing to hold flu clinics at former Hamilton public library as a short-term solution until Town decides what it is going to do with the building.

Karen Zagorski moved the Board of Health accept the Partner’s Home Care contract. Willnow seconded the motion. VOTE: Unanimous.

### **Review – Board of Health Minutes dated 5/11/10**

A change was made on page 2 to read that Health Agent Leslie Whelan will forward an application for variance found on the DEP website to Paul Ricker who will send the application to DEP for its approval.

It was noted that the Acord food pantry has not been inspected yet. Also, Willnow has not checked the Northeast Mosquito Control District website regarding mosquitoes in Town. He expects the Board to deal with this more in the fall.

Willnow moved the Board of Health accept the May 11, 2010 minutes as amended. Zagorski seconded the motion. VOTE: Unanimous.

**Old Business, New Business**

Discussion was on Whelan and Hamilton Building Inspector Charles Brett being asked to inspect Club Excel on Willow Street for mold and water problems as well as other issues with the building. After inspection, the Town officials ordered the landlord, Hansbury Trust, to repair the facility. Apparently the repairs didn't occur so the club moved out.

Discussion on Whelan speaking to parties interested in developing 44 senior housing units at Canterbrook Farms about concerns raised by Hamilton resident Zachary Peters at a previous Board meeting. She said plans are for two-bedroom units.

Discussion on meeting held with Whelan and Town Manager Michael Lombardo regarding emergency preparedness. She also spoke to Fire Chief Phil Stevens about the role the Board of Health would play during a bioterrorist event and dispensing antibiotics within a brief period of time.

Quarterly meetings will be held with other Town departments about emergency issues.

Willnow moved at 8:06 p.m. to adjourn. Zagorski seconded the motion. VOTE: Unanimous. The Board's next meeting is on Tuesday, July 20 at 7:30 p.m.
