**OVERDOSES:** The leading cause of accidental death in the U.S., drug overdose and addition can happen to anyone; young or old, from any demographic, and for a host of reasons. The statistics for drug overdoses are alarming; in 2015, there were 52,204 lethal overdoses. Opioid addiction is driving this epidemic, with 20,101 overdose deaths related to prescription pain relievers, and 12,990 overdoses deaths related to heroin in 2015. **TEEN ALCOHOL:** 25% of high school students report binge drinking (having 5 or more drinks of alcohol in a row in a couple of hours) in the past 30 days. (Aggregate data from Youth Risk Behavior Surveys conducted in 2015-2016 across Cape Ann, (Gloucester, Rockport, Beverly, Manchester, Essex and Ipswich)). 61% of 12th graders across the US have reported using alcohol at some point in their lives. (NIDA, Monitoring the Future Study, 2014)
