# OPEN BURNING RULES AND REGULATIONS

#### Open burning with a PERMIT of the following material is allowed:

- \* Brush, cane, driftwood, and forestry debris
- \* Materials normally associated with the pursuit of agriculture, such as fruit tree prunings, dead raspberry stalks, blueberry patches for pruning purposes, infected beehives for disease control.
- \* Trees and brush resulting from agricultural land clearing.

### **Guidelines for conducting open burning**

- \* Burning must be at least 75 feet from all dwellings,
- \* Burning must take place on land closest to the source of the material being burned.
- \* Before placing the materials to be burned remove all grass from area.
- \* Before burning brush, dry by cutting and covering in advance.

### While Burning

- \* Someone MUST attend the fire until completely extinguished.
- \* Have available a water supply, shovels or rakes for controlling the fire.
- \* Burn the fire down to coals and spread the coals with snow, water, sand or soil.

# **Burning of the following materials is PROHIBITED statewide:**

- \* Burning of building materials
- \* Brush, trees, cane, and driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.
- \* Grass, leaves, hay, stumps, and tires.
- All burning will cease and fires shall be extinguished by 4:00 PM.
- The Hamilton and Wenham Fire Departments reserve the right to inspect the burning site at any time.
- Cost of calls to extinguish fires after regular burning hours will be at the property owners expense.
- Burning season is from January 15 May 1.
- Owner MUST renew permit DAILY, 468-5513 PRIOR TO BURNING
- Permits will be issued to property owners only.
- Brush only shall be burned.
