Access for All - Library Services and Technology Grant

Last summer, on July 7, 2022 the Library was awarded a two-year \$14,000 grant through the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners. The **Access for All** grant is focused on improving accessibility to library services and programs to all members of the community. There are four key components to our grant, outlined below. Please pass it on to anyone that wants a bridge to library services.

Assistive Technology

Assistive technology items allow the Library to address the needs of community members with hearing or vision loss. Circulating items include: handheld magnifiers, an electronic magnifier, a sound amplifier, and 10 Launchpands pre-loaded with brain games. Circulating assistive technology is located on the first floor of the library.

Memory Cafes & Memory Kits

Memory Cafes provide support and socializing for adults living with dementia or Alzheimer's and their caregivers. These are held once a month at the library and each meeting will have an activity or presenter. Meetings scheduled so far are as follows:

Wednesday, February 15 – 10:30-11:30 am – Musician Adam McCauley. Read more and register. Tuesday, March 7 – 10:30-11:30 am – Ventriloquist Kevin Driscoll. Read more and register. Memory Kits are circulating sets of activities for adults living with dementia or Alzheimer's and their caregivers. Each kit has a theme and includes various items to encourage engagement and discussion. Kits can be checked out for three weeks. Themes include: Winter, Spring, Summer, Fall, Birds, America, Sports, Trains, Travel, and Pets. Memory Kits are located on the first floor of the library. Home Delivery



I was just thinking...

about a stamp I have in my collection. It commemorates the sinking of the SS Dorchester which was torpedoed off the coast of Greenland on February 3, 1943. The ship was carrying 900 members of the U S Army. They were headed for the European Theater. 209 survived the attack. Of all those who died that morning four were U S Army Chaplains. They had just completed Chaplains School. Two of them were Protestant ministers, one was a Reformed Rabbi, and one was a Roman Catholic Priest. At the time of the attack the chaplains were seen passing out life jackets to the soldiers. When there were no more, each chaplain gave his life jacket to a soldier. An eyewitness told his rescuers, "I saw the four of them at the stern of the ship holding hands and praying and then they disappeared with the ship. Chaplains Cox, Poling, Goode and Washington are remembered for their self forgetful love of the "the other person." They did not learn this in Chaplains School. They lived it. Their different faith traditions and family backgrounds shaped their response to cries of desperation they heard in the darkness of the North Atlantic. In the words of Martin Luther King, Jr they exhibited "the strength to love."
