October 15 - December 7 Every year, you have an opportunity to review and make changes to your Medicare plans with a SHINE counselor. See what you can expect with your current plan in the new year or if there is another plan that may be more cost effective for you. You may benefit from cost saving programs that our SHINE counselor will explain to you. Marylou Fierro, our SHINE Counsellor offers this service by phone for free.

Greetings from Hamilton: Open Enrollment officially started on October 15th and will run until the first week in December. I strongly suggest that if you have any sort of Medicare you reach out to ensure that you are still on the best plan for you! Every year the plans change.

We will be welcoming National Grid on Monday November 7th between 10:00am and 2:00pm to review your bill, discount plans, etc. (See inside for more info).

Veteran's Corner - Wenham


... I was just thinking

-about Veterans Day and how different it is from Memorial Day. On Memorial Day we honor those who died in defense of our country. On Veterans Day we express gratitude to those who wore the uniform and who continue to wear the uniform of the United States of America. Memorial Day emerges out of the devastation of our civil war. Veterans Day emerges from World War I. It was in the dawn of November 11, 1918 that the Armistice was signed. On that day the guns became silent. "The war to end all wars" was brought to an end by the stroke of a pen. However, trench warfare, mustard gas, rampant disease, machine guns, tanks and aerial attacks left indelible marks in the landscape of Europe and scarred the bodies, hearts and souls of about 40 million military and civilian casualties. During the years that followed, many national leaders declared that November 11 would be known as "A Day of Remembrance" and marked with two minutes of silence. For many on the battlefield two minutes can seem like an eternity as they are exposed to the fleeting nature of life. For those of us stuck in traffic two minutes can seem like an eternity because we are frustrated. On November 11 we are encouraged to spend two minutes in silence. When we do, let us remember that life is a gift.






